Sermon Text: Hebrews 1:1-4 "The Supremacy of the Son of God"

The prologue of Hebrews summarizes the book and declares the supremacy of Jesus Christ in four verses: Jesus is the final word, the creator and sustainer, the purifier, and the reigning king.

1. Introduction: The Ascension of Jesus to the right hand of God the Father confirms His status as the Second Person of the Triune God.

- c. The Purifier
- d. The Reigning King

3. Summary and Application: Jesus is better! We must live as if we believe that to be true.
