Moment for Missions

Garry & Anita C, Caribbean

Dear Partners in ministry,

As a new month begins, we are thankful for God's faithfulness in our lives. On September 1st we drove to Atlanta where we had a full schedule of meetings with MTW staff, other organization leaders with whom we partner, and co-laborers with us in Grenada. The side benefit of the trip was that we stayed with our oldest daughter, Caryann, and her family. Always great to have family time, especially with the fast growing up grandkids.

We were disappointed that the marriage seminar for a Haitian church in the eastern part of the Dominican Republic (DR) was canceled due to tensions between the DR and the Haitian diaspora living in the DR. Please pray for this situation which started over a border irrigation canal project.

On Tuesday, the 3rd, we go to the DR for the MTW Americas Area Retreat. This is a retreat for all MTW missionaries serving in South and Central America, the Caribbean, Mexico, and those serving among the Indigenous populations of the USA and Canada (about 75 family units). Pray for a time of spiritual refreshment, rest, and networking as we gather together. We also praise God for answered prayer as there were two tropical storms headed toward the DR and both have turned north and will not interfere with the retreat. This retreat is two years late due to postponement from the Covid pandemic.

Anita will travel to Belize for two weeks on October 14th. One of the clinic nurses is on medical leave and Anita will help at the clinic and also orient a visiting nurse who will help for 3 weeks at the clinic. While Anita is in Belize, Garry will make a trip to Grenada on the 16th to be present for the first Youth Ministry Training Program class. We are so excited that this program is launching. Pray that it will impact the Caribbean by training people to minister to youth and seeing those youth becoming future leaders for the Caribbean churches. Some students will attend in person and others will join via Zoom from Nassau, St. Vincent, and Belize. Garry will also spend two days in Port of Spain, Trinidad with a ministry partner before returning to Grenada and then back home. Please be praying for the trips and for God to use us to minister to those we meet.

The storage building at the Belize clinic is completed (see pictures on your Ministry Wall) and is filling up fast as items are sorted and brought out of the old storage facilities. A big thank you to everyone who contributed to this project!
