- b. Exhaust it All (vv. 12b-14)
 - i. Press On (v. 12b; cf. also Matt. 5:11; 2 Timothy 3:12)
 - ii. Strain Forward (v. 13b)
 - iii. **Application:** Beloved, are you on a mission to know Jesus and to grow in Jesus?
- c. Motive (v. 12)
 - i. Application: Press on, because Christ pressed on for your perfection.

Moment for Missions

Dear Partners in ministry,

We apologize for being late with the May Update and Belize Prayer calendar. Anita returned from Belize Saturday afternoon and I returned from Nairobi, Kenya late Saturday night. Anita will give an update on her time in Belize and I will give an update on my time in Belize and Kenya.

Garry and I arrived in Belize together on April 6, with the tasks of leading a small medical team and helping Pam Murray, clinic administrator with clinic board related details. I enjoyed working with our volunteers, Dr. and Mrs. John Dean, Dr. and Mrs. Deny and Scharine with niece, Melissa Katzenmaier and Becca Howell, RN. Becca is an intern with MTW serving at the clinic for several months, lending much needed support for the 2 nurse staff members. Also, it was back to basic cooking, enduring the heat and bugs, hanging laundry on the clothesline, in addition to the jobs they gave me to do with patient care.

God is answering prayer for the Belize churches as I saw churches organizing activities for their youth, children, and an upcoming church 50th anniversary (in Patchakan) they will celebrate in September. I'm thankful for being able to support a dear friend as she faces continued chemotherapy treatment for cancer and another friend as she grieves the loss of her beloved husband. What an answer to prayer when some close friends of ours approached me to report that their "shakey" marriage has brought them closer to the Lord and they are serving in local ministry now! To God be the glory for all He has done in giving us strength and protection to serve Him while in Belize!

I (Garry) spent 10 days in Belize caring for MTW and Clinic government regulatory paperwork, meeting with Presbyterian Church in Belize leadership for planning, and had the privilege to preach at the Patchakan and Calcutta churches. I then flew to Atlanta on the 16th and connected with a group from a supporting church where our son-in-law serves as a pastor to serve at Vijiji Children's Home of Light. Our daughter, Caryann, was a member of the team and I was asked to prepare the teaching lessons for the children and to assist in evaluating the ministry and its future needs. It was a privilege to teach two of the lessons and to see the kids respond to the teaching of God's Word. It was interesting to compare Kenya with Haiti. Many similarities yet many differences as Kenya was an English colony and Haiti a French colony. Also, Kenya has a more ethnically diverse population.

Please continue to pray for Belize. The May Belize Prayer Calendar is on your church's Mission Wall.

Also pray for Haiti as the situation continues to be very unsettled.
