Dear Partners in ministry,

Greetings from Belize! We just finished a good week with Gracepoint Presbyterian Church who served in Patchakan at Holy Trinity Presbyterian Church. The concrete roof is finished and the church will continue with plastering the wall and installing windows and doors to complete the upstairs youth Sunday School/meeting room. The team also visited local families in their homes together with church members and assisted the local church with Vacation Bible School. Church members gave the lessons and the team worked alongside team members to do crafts and games. Thank you to Gracepoint! The next team arrives on July 13th.

Sunday morning, we had a glimpse of Heaven with the Gracepoint team. The church service was in Spanish with some English songs. Pastor Lim, preached in Korean with Dr. Won Kim translating to English. It was a unique service with many people taking video clips to remember the occasion. Heaven will be a gathering of people from every nation, people, tribe, and tongue! What a glorious day that will be!

We would ask prayer for the southern Caribbean as Hurricane Beryl is scheduled to hit Saint Vincent and Grenada on Monday as a mega hurricane. Please pray that God will protect life and property and that the storm would not intensify over the next two days. The storm track goes near the Dominican Republic and Haiti, Tuesday night Wednesday morning, then a direct hit on Jamaica Wednesday afternoon. Then it will head towards northern Belize/Mexico (right where we are). Ask God to dissipate this storm and to protect people who are already facing food insecurity and other difficulties.

Anita is serving in the clinic helping with the two summer interns, a nurse and a nursing student. Also, other visitors Dr. Won Kim (internal medicine/pediatrics) and his wife, Dr. Jeannette Kim (a dentist) served at the clinic while the team served at the church. There are several other medical visitors coming this summer.

Garry will be preaching most Sundays that we are here along with board meetings, meetings with national pastors and church leaders, and seeking to help with future plans for ministry in Belize.

We appreciate your prayers for wisdom, health, strength, and sensitivity to the Holy Spirit's guidance in every aspect of the ministries we will do this summer. Thank you! The Belize Prayer Calendar is posted on your church Missions Wall, to assist you in praying for the ministry here.
