We are in Nassau staying with MTW missionaries Tim and Bev Hart. Recently, the four of us visited three neighborhoods with Pastor Jude Vilma (associate pastor of outreach at St. Andrews Presbyterian Kirk Church). The church has outreach in the three communities of Grants Town, Bains Town, and Yellow Elder. This includes youth outreach, assisting needy families with food, and academic tutoring. Please pray for Pastor Jude, the Harts, and others who are seeking guidance on how to advance the ministry in these communities to bring spiritual life, joy, and peace to peoples' lives.

This month is the beginning of the Caribbean/Belize Prayer Calendar. Thank you to Karen Stodghill for her faithfulness in doing the Belize calendar over the last years! We hope that the inclusion of ministries throughout the Caribbean will be helpful to you in praying for the ministry God has given us. Please see the calendar on your church's Missions Wall.

On March 18 we return to Belize for a two week stay. Garry will preach at several churches, meet with church leaders, prepare for summer short-term teams, meet with missionaries and local church pastors and elders, and complete administrative duties. Anita will be assisting at the clinic.
